

Logistics Committee for increasing electronics exports from India

The mobile and electronics manufacturing sector has been a cornerstone of India's journey from an import-dependent nation to an export-driven economy. This growth trajectory, from USD 37 billion in 2015 to over USD 115 billion in domestic production in 2024, underscores the transformative potential of this sector. Electronics exports now rank as India's 5th largest export commodity, reaching USD 29.1 billion in FY23-24 with a 24% year-on-year growth. To sustain and enhance this momentum, it is imperative to develop a robust logistics ecosystem that supports the seamless movement of raw materials and finished goods.

To address these needs, ICEA constituted a Logistics Committee which will identify challenges, propose actionable solutions, and foster an ecosystem conducive to boosting India's electronics exports.

Objectives of the Logistics Committee

- 1. **Strengthening domestic ecosystem**: Enabling the growth of the domestic electronics export ecosystem.
- 2. **Identifying gaps and challenges**: Evaluating current logistics infrastructure and processes and identifying areas requiring improvement.
- 3. **Propose actionable recommendations**: Based on deliberations, the committee will suggest actionable outcomes for enhancing and upgrading infrastructure at airports/seaports, transportation, warehousing, and technological capabilities.
- 4. **Policy support**: Develop policies promoting efficiency, security, and sustainability in logistics.
